

OPERATION ICECAP 32 - EQUIPMENT LIST

Winter camping in Manitoba requires that special care and attention is paid to clothing. The list below is the **MINIMUM** recommended clothing list.

Leaders are responsible for the safety and comfort of your child this weekend. Camp Administration cannot allow any youth to go to camp who does not have the minimum recommended clothing list.

Scouts Canada's By-Laws, Policies and Procedures specifies that each youth's gear must be checked before it is packed in a vehicle.

Note: Any youth who do not have the minimum recommended clothing, may not be allowed to participate in some camp activities and events.

Minimum Required Clothing & Equipment List

Full Uniform	2 extra pairs of light socks
2-3 pairs heavy socks	2 long-sleeved shirts
2 pairs long johns/snow pants	1 parka (fleece or hoodie second layer)
2 pairs of warm pants	1 toque (2 if possible)
2 extra pairs of underpants	2 pairs of warm mitts
1 pair of winter boots (2 if possible)	1 pair of indoor shoes
1 scarf (2 if possible)	Extra pair of sweats – backup spare
2 pairs of pajamas	

Other :

- Sleeping Bag
- Pillow
- Flashlight
- Wash-up Kit—Toothbrush and paste, Face cloth and towel, Soap, Comb, Kleenex)
- Extra Light-Colored T-shirt for Silk Screening
- Extra blanket (optional)

****** Please label all clothing and equipment.** Helps to ensure lost items are returned.

ALL MEALS AND SNACKS ARE PROVIDED BY CAMP ARNES.

- Specialty food for dietary restrictions can be dropped off Camp Arnes kitchen staff for storage. Camp registration should identify all allergies and dietary requirements.
- **No food or drinks are allowed in the cabins.** Please do not bring any extra food.
- Youth medications are to be managed by group's leaders.

Note: Electronics are not permitted at camp (accept personal cameras). Youth Cellphone's as cameras are not required. Leader phones on vibrate at all times.
